About the Book:

Discussion Points:

- How does Evelyn's grief shape her actions throughout the novel? Do you sympathise with her desire for revenge, or does she cross a line? How does the novel portray the different ways people process loss?
- Tobias and Evelyn deal with the same tragedy in starkly different ways. How does grief affect their relationship? What do you think drives Tobias to protect Aaron?
- The novel asks who gets to decide when justice has been served. Where does justice end and revenge begin? Do you think the legal punishment Aaron received was enough? What do you think of his attempts to rebuild his life? Can guilt ever be fully resolved?
- The novel's title invites reflection. Do you think Aaron achieves redemption? Is redemption truly possible in the wake of such a devastating act?
- How did the shifting perspectives and escalating pace affect your reading experience? Were you surprised by any of the twists, and how did your sympathies shift over time?
- In a story with so much emotional complexity, who did you view as the 'villain,' if anyone? Did your perception change as the story unfolded?
